

Notice of Meeting and Agenda

TRUCKEE MEADOWS FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

9:00 a.m. Tuesday, May 19, 2020

No members of the public will be allowed in the BCC Chambers due to concerns for public safety resulting from the COVID-19 emergency and pursuant to the Governor of Nevada's Declaration of Emergency Directive 006 Section 1 which suspends the requirement in NRS 241.023(1)(b) that there be a physical location designated for meetings of public bodies where members of the public are permitted to attend and participate. This meeting will be held by teleconference only.

NOTE: Items on the agenda may be taken out of order; combined with other items; removed from the agenda; moved to the agenda of another meeting; moved to or from the Consent section; or may be voted on in a block. Items with a specific time designation will not be heard prior to the stated time, but may be heard later.

The Washoe County Commission Chambers is accessible to the disabled. If you require special arrangements for the meeting, call the Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District Office, 326-6000, 24-hours prior to the meeting.

<u>Time Limits</u>. Public comments are welcomed during the Public Comment periods for all matters, whether listed on the agenda or not, and are limited to three minutes per person. Additionally, public comment of three minutes per person will be heard during individual action items on the agenda. Persons are invited to submit comments in writing on the agenda items and/or attend and make comment on that item at the Board meeting. Persons may not allocate unused time to other speakers.

Forum Restrictions and Orderly Conduct of Business. The Board conducts the business of the District and its citizens during its meetings. The presiding officer may order the removal of any person whose statement or other conduct disrupts the orderly, efficient or safe conduct of the meeting. Warnings against disruptive comments or behavior may or may not be given prior to removal. The viewpoint of a speaker will not be restricted, but reasonable restrictions may be imposed upon the time, place and manner of speech. Irrelevant and unduly repetitious statements and personal attacks which antagonize or incite others are examples of speech that may be reasonably limited.

Public Comment. Public comment, whether on action items or general public comment, is limited to three (3) minutes per person. No action may be taken on a matter raised under general public comment until the matter is included on an agenda as an item on which action may be taken. As required by the Governor's Declaration of Emergency Directive 006 Section 2, members of the public may submit public comment by logging into the ZOOM webinar by accessing the following link: https://us02web.zoom.us/j/85095311836. NOTE: This option will require a computer with audio and video capabilities. Additionally, public comment can be submitted via email to washoe311@washoecounty.us. The District will make reasonable efforts to include all comments received for public comment by email in the record. Please try to provide comments by 4:00 p.m. on May 18, 2020.

Pursuant to NRS 241.020, the Agenda for the Board of Fire Commissioners has been electronically posted at www.washoecounty.us/tmfpd/fire_commissioners/ and https://notice.nv.gov. Pursuant to Section 3 of the Declaration of Emergency Directive 006 ("Directive 006"), the requirement contained in NRS 241.023(1)(b) that there be a physical location designated for meetings of public bodies where members of the public are permitted to attend and further, the requirement that notice agendas be physically posted within the State of Nevada has been suspended.

9. Discussion and possible approval of the Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District Tentative Budget, including possible changes and/or action to adopt the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2020-21. This item may be continued to Tuesday, May 26, 2020 at 9:00 AM. Estimated Fiscal Year 2020-21 general fund revenues are \$31,340,644, and estimated general fund expenditures are (\$33,066,923), broken down into the following 10 cost centers: Standalone (Overhead), Administration, Operations, Training, Fire Prevention, Fleet Maintenance, Fuels Management, Emergency Medical, Logistics, Reserve/Volunteer Program. In addition to the general fund expenditures, the proposed budget also includes expenditures from the following 6 other funds: Capital Projects Fund (\$14,250,430); Emergency Fund (\$1,482,950); Sick, Annual, and Comp Benefits Fund (\$690,000); Stabilization Fund (\$550,000); Debt Service Fund (\$624,600); and Worker's Comp Internal Service/Proprietary Fund (\$257,500). Total estimated expenditures under the general fund and additional 6 funds in this proposed budget is approximately \$50,922,403 plus an additional \$100,000 debt issuance cost and \$620,000 contingency. 10. NRS 350.020 Public hearing on the proposed issuance of the Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District's General Obligation (Limited Tax) Capital Improvement Bonds (Additionally Secured By Pledged Revenues) in the maximum principal amount of \$2,100,000 to defray wholly or in part the cost of acquisition of properties for stations authorized by NRS 474.511-512, including fixtures, structures, stations, other buildings and sites therefore and appurtenances and incidentals necessary, useful or desirable for any such facilities, including all types of property therefor. The proposed bonds will be secured by a pledge of 15% of the District's receipt of Consolidated Taxes. Budgeted Consolidated Taxes in fiscal year 2020 are \$9,134,413, and the corresponding amount pledged to repayment of the proposed bonds is \$1,370,162. Maximum annual debt service on the proposed bonds is estimated to be \$151,350, and debt service will be repaid over a 20-year period. (All Commission Districts) PUBLIC HEARING
