Summer 2022 Outlook - June, July, & August






Heavily favoring for warmer than normal - Heat waves more likely. Earlier onset to fire season. Drought persists or intensifies.

No favored outcome on precipitation - means anything from a quiet to a busy summer t-storm season.


Thoughts on April-July Water Supply Outlook




Key Takeaways

- Seasonal creeks & ponds will dry out sooner than




California - Precipitation


- Long term drought curtails new grass growth. But big time stresses to existing vegetation including timber & juniper, which tends to favor having larger, plume dominated fires.
- Above normal precip & soil moisture tends to yield increased fine fuel grass growth. But how will super dry January through March impact that?
- Numbers of thunderstorm -or- windy & dry days are very much TBD those are big drivers in how busy a fire season we have.

Significant Wildland Fire Pote

September 2022







- Fuel (grass) continuity is a wildcard for Great Basin.
- Drought stressed timber big concerns for Sierra, N California.
- Be prepared for another smoke season from large fires.



NWS Reno Support for Wildfire Smoke Days

Partner with Washoe Co AQMD and others to keep community informed. Brief schools, airports, fire services.

Every hour, NWS high resolution smoke

models run out to 48 hours using new fire detections + meteorological variables.

Significant predictability limits of smoke, especially past 24 hours.

Helping Partners Make More Informed Decisions

Scenarios

"Most Likely" vs "Worst Case" Being Prepared.

Confidence

Forecaster experience & what the models say. High vs low confidence = different decisions.



Probabilities

What weather is important to you and how likely is that to happen?









Fire Weather Watch

- ✓ 2-5 days in advance
- Medium confidence (~40-60% probability)
- ✓ Critical fire weather: 30+ MPH wind gusts and 15% humidity for 3+ hours -ornumerous dry t-storms



Red Flag Warning

- ✓ 1-3 days in advance
- ✓ High confidence (80%+ probability)
- Critical fire weather conditions.
- ✓ Roughly 10-20 Red Flag days each year, but varies!

Particularly Dangerous Situation (PDS) Red Flag Warning

- ✓ 1-2 days in advance
- Extremely high confidence (95%+ probability)
- Rare events of extreme wind, low humidity, and dry fuels. 50+ MPH wind gusts but can vary. **Evacuation readiness vital!**
- ✓ 1 per year or every other year.
